When to use NHS 111 online or call 111

NHS 111 can help if you think you need medical help right now.

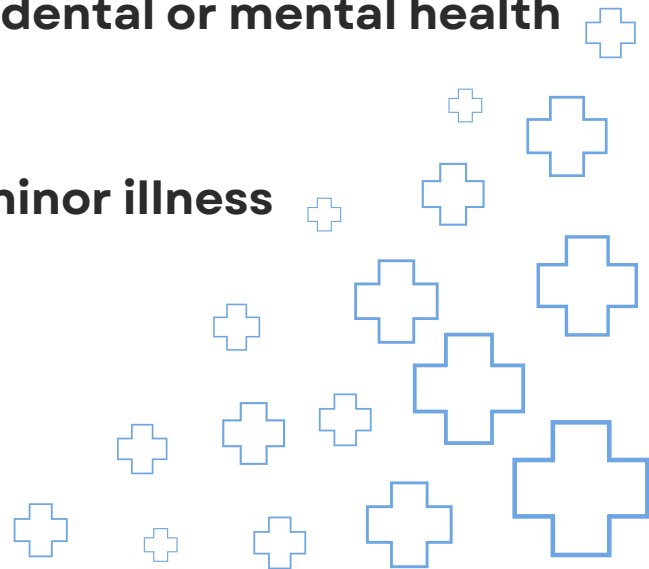
You can get help from NHS 111:

- **by using 111 online**
- **in the NHS App**
- **by calling 111**

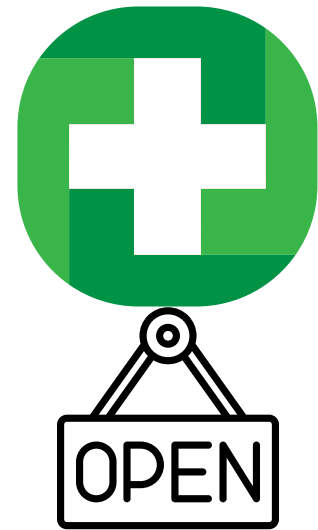
111 can direct you to the best place to get help if you cannot contact your GP during the day, or when your GP is closed (out-of-hours).

Depending on what you need, you might be advised to:

- **call 999 or go to A&E in an emergency**
- **go to an urgent treatment centre**
- **see an evening and weekend GP (out-of-hours GP)**
- **book a callback from a nurse**
- **get urgent specialist support, for dental or mental health problems**
- **contact your own GP surgery**
- **see a pharmacist for help with a minor illness**
- **look after yourself safely at home**

Surgery Updates

Primary Care Network Social Prescribing update

At the last PPG meeting, Kayleigh, a PCN Manager, gave a presentation on the Guildford East Community Link Social Prescribing service.

The service supports patients with non-medical issues affecting wellbeing, including housing, relationships, loneliness, finances, employment, and carers' support.

The team currently consists of 2 social prescribers, with a 3rd due to start at Easter.

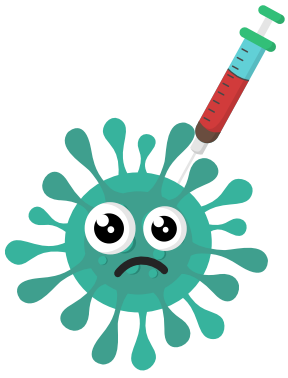
Support is delivered face-to-face in practices and community locations. There is a local 4-stage pathway:

1. Initial assessment
2. Research and joint planning
3. Short-term follow-up
4. Longer-term follow-up

Early patient feedback has been positive. Social prescribing helps you with your well-being. It takes a holistic view and recognises that many things affect the way we feel. If you are lonely or isolated, or you are worrying about money or feeling anxious, you may find your usual enjoyment of life takes a knock.

Life events, like bereavement, an illness or a fall can all trigger a downward spiral in our personal well-being. Social prescribing can help to address these things by finding out what is important to you and then putting you in touch with the people and activities that might help you to feel better.

Vaccinations

Covid Spring Booster

The Covid Spring Booster will be offered again this year at the surgery for all patients over the age 75. Those patients with auto immune systems will hear directly from NHS England regarding their illegibility.

MMRV Vaccine – The Essentials

What it is

The MMRV vaccine protects against four diseases:

- Measles
- Mumps
- Rubella (German measles)
- Chickenpox (varicella)

Why it matters

These infections spread very easily and can cause serious complications, including:

- Meningitis
- Brain inflammation (encephalitis)
- Pneumonia
- Hearing loss

Who it's for

Mainly young children as part of the NHS routine vaccination schedule:

- Some older children may also be offered it
- Older kids/adults (born before end of 2019) may still get the MMR vaccine instead (no chickenpox protection)



Patient Partner – Voice Connect

We now have a dedicated phone line to help you manage some of your GP services: **01483 314059**

This number will also be available on our website. You can use it if you normally call the surgery to request prescriptions.

What you can do with Voice Connect (from 8 December)

When you call, you'll be able to:

- Order a repeat prescription
- Cancel an appointment
- Request an appointment

Please note:

Patients under 16 cannot order medication through this system.

Getting started:

The first time you use Voice Connect:

1. Call the dedicated number.
2. You'll be asked for your date of birth.
3. You'll also be asked for your telephone number. This must be the number we have on your medical record.
4. You'll then be asked to create a PIN. This PIN is your key to using the system in the future, so please keep it safe.

If you forget your PIN, just contact the surgery and we can help.

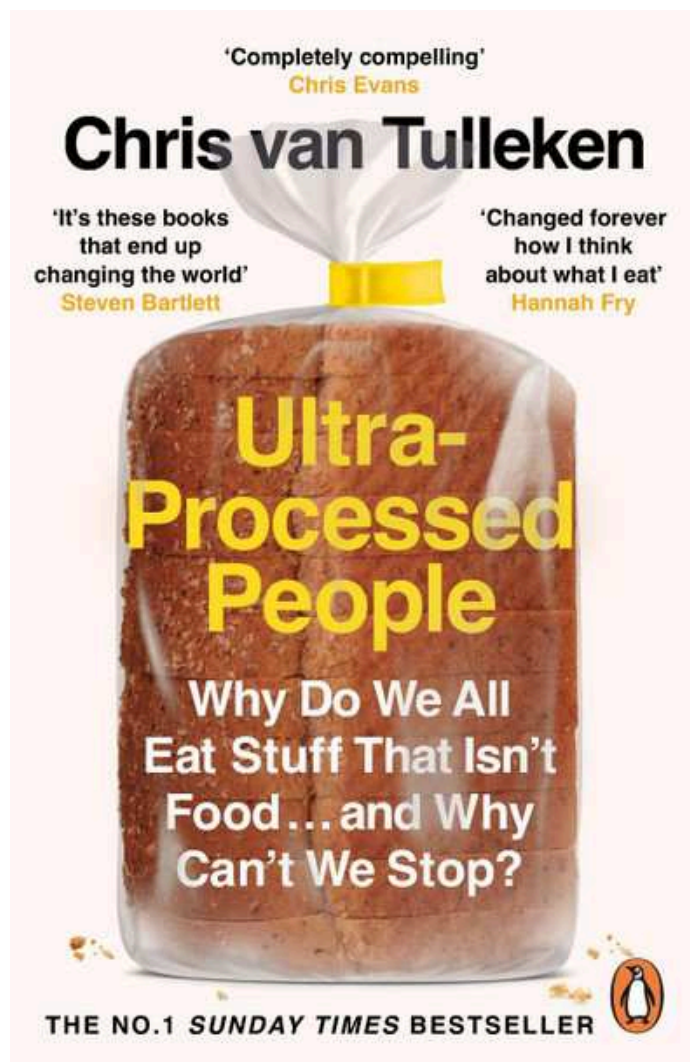
In some cases

If another patient has the same date of birth and the same phone number as you (for example, shared household numbers), you won't be able to set up the system yourself. In this situation, please contact the practice and we will set it up for you.

Book recommendation



Dr S McKelvie has given us another fantastic book recommendation - *Ultra Processed People: Why do we all eat stuff that isn't food... and why can't we stop?* by Chris van Tulleken.



Ultra-Processed People by Chris van Tulleken explores how much of what we eat today isn't really "food" in the traditional sense, but ultra-processed products designed for convenience, shelf life, and profit.

These foods are engineered to be irresistible, often combining additives, flavourings, and textures that encourage us to eat more while giving us less nutritional value. The book challenges the idea that poor diet is simply down to personal choice, showing instead how our food environment has been shaped to make overconsumption the default.

Rather than focusing on guilt or willpower, van Tulleken highlights how ultra-processed foods affect our appetite, gut health, and long-term wellbeing, often disrupting the body's natural signals that tell us when we're full. He also examines the role of the food industry in shaping what's available and how it's marketed, making it harder to avoid these products. The key takeaway is not perfection, but awareness: understanding how these foods work is the first step towards making more informed choices in a system that doesn't always make that easy.

Dementia Clinics from Dementia UK

Admiral Nurses from Dementia UK offer support with getting a diagnosis, understanding symptoms, communication, planning future care, managing behaviour changes, and coping with grief or care transitions.

Free dementia support clinics will be held in Woking and Guildford in April, taking place in private, accessible rooms inside Nationwide Building Society branches.

Nationwide has already held clinics in more than 250 branches, and they are open to anyone living with dementia, worried about their memory, or caring for someone with dementia. People do not need to be Nationwide customers to access this support.

Eligibility for shingles vaccine

If you have a severely weakened immune system (as described in the Green book chapter) you will be offered the shingles vaccine from 18 years of age.

If you are over 70 years of age and have not had shingles vaccine before you remain eligible up to your 80th birthday.
