Action for Carers Surrey

Action for Carers provide help for carers across Surrey. Young carers, adult carers, professionals who work with carers. With accessible information online, over the phone or in person at their hubs.

Action for Carers are running a number of events across Surrey alongside their [Carers Hubs](#) that run twice a month. In the upcoming months carers can find:

- Parent Carer groups
- First Aid training
- Moving and Handling tips
- Mental Health support groups

Crossroads Care Surrey

Crossroads Care Surrey is a charity supporting unpaid carers for over 40 years. The service offers compassionate care and support services to help carers manage their responsibilities while maintaining their well-being.



Emergency Care Planning service: Provides 24/7 support, ensuring loved ones receive care if unexpected situations occur.

End of Life Care service: Offers support during the final months of a loved one's life, ensuring comfort and dignity.

Surrey Carers Card: The carers card contains the contact details of your substitute carer and is a good choice if you already have a trusted second person who can step in to provide care.

Respite Care service: Grants carers the break which they so desperately need, allowing them to recharge while knowing their loved ones are in safe hands. This is a self-funded service.

Surrey County Council

A reminder of the new [Carer Breaks Payment Service](#) run by Adult Social Care.

The one-off £300 payment – to be provided on a pre-paid card - can be used in any way that supports a carer's wellbeing, such as a short break, a hobby or course, fitness activity, or help in the home. It could also be used for respite care or specialist equipment.

Please help raise awareness of this new offer to support carer wellbeing across Surrey. The payment is aimed at carers who are early in their caring journey or have recently been recognised as carers – it is not for carers who are receiving support from adult social care or have had a previous carer's payment or break offer.

The new offer is different from the carers' GP personal health budget (PHB), which can only be accessed via a clinician at a GP practice. Carers are eligible for either a PHB or a carers' wellbeing payment, but not both.

Surrey Carers Free Flu Vaccine

With flu season around the corner, the overall aim of the campaign is to increase the number of unpaid Carers in Surrey receiving flu jabs via the carers flu scheme.

Flu season runs from 1st October to 31st March. We need to continue to encourage unpaid carers to register as a carer with their GP as this will allow them to receive their flu vaccine within the surgery and access many other benefits the practices may have on offer for unpaid carers.

Unpaid carers are able access the free flu vaccine through their GP or from a local community pharmacy.

Vaccination hesitancy research briefing

During the last year Luminus has completed 3 research studies about why older people, people, from ethnically minoritized communities, and care workers are reluctant to take-up a COVID-19 and flu vaccination or booster.



This is an invitation to hear the main findings and recommendations via a free online session talking about the main barriers to taking up COVID-19 and flu vaccines and sharing tips on how to increase the number of people who have a vaccination.

Neighbourhood navigation is coming to east Surrey

First Community has launched a new social prescribing service in east Surrey known as Neighbourhood navigation, which will be going live soon. The aim is to empower people to manage existing health or social issues, by accessing appropriate support.

Healthcare professionals will be able to refer patients via the [Joy online platform](#) to a range of local, non-clinical services that can help with social, emotional, and practical needs. These services might include things like joining community groups, exercise classes, taking part in arts and crafts activities, or accessing practical support like debt advice or bereavement support.

The service will be supported by the [Joy online platform](#) where all listings will be located.

Banstead Social Prescribing opens for self-referrals

From 1 July 2025, adults registered with a GP in Banstead can now refer themselves to the local Social Prescribing service, run by Mary Frances Trust. The service continues to accept referrals from GPs and other health professionals.

Social Prescribing helps people with emotional wellbeing, loneliness, healthy lifestyle changes, employment or volunteering, welfare advice, and support for carers. It connects individuals to local community services that can offer the right kind of help.

Fuel poverty cookery courses

The Communities & Prevention Coordinators within Adults Wellbeing and Health Partnerships in Surrey County Council are collaborating with community partners across Surrey to deliver fuel-efficient cookery courses. These courses teach practical skills and knowledge about healthy eating, and participants receive energy-efficient cooking equipment to help them continue these habits long term. So far, 202 people have signed up, and over sixty-seven air fryers or slow cookers have been distributed. The sessions will continue to run until autumn.

Community hubs

A new network of free local hubs is launching across Surrey. These drop-in sessions will run weekly in key neighbourhoods, offering a friendly space for people to find help, advice and signposting to local resources.

Carer Rights Day

[Carer's Rights Day](#) falls on the 20th of November 2025, this year's theme is 'Know your rights, use your rights.'

This day aims to raise awareness of carers and the rights they have in the community and workplace.

As a carer, knowing your rights empowers you with information about what you are entitled to. This helps you feel confident asking for what you need, as well as challenging things when your rights are not being met – whether that be in the workplace or education, in accessing health or social care, or when interacting with other professionals or at home.

Carers Week Reflections

Carers Week within Surrey Heartland's was a success with multiple events held across the offices and carer information tables at Horizon House and Dukes Court for staff to pickup leaflets and advice.

As part of the teams aim to distribute helpful information to carers across the organisation, we compiled information packs such as a 'Carers A-Z guide' to collate as many services in document as covering as many conditions as we could.

Through conversations with staff, we also identified employees who were caring for individuals outside of Surrey which led us to create a cross-border support sheet detailing services outside of the county.
