

When you contact the practice to book an appointment, you will be asked about your medical issue.



This is to enable our trained staff to direct your problem to the appropriate clinician.



You do not have to provide this information, however it may help your situation to be dealt with more efficiently.



On some occasions you may not necessarily need to be seen by a clinician, but our staff will be able to inform you of other services available.

We are please to welcome **Abdul Ireed** to ARS, a qualified pharmacist who can prescribe medication if necessary.

Patients will be invited to see Abdul at the surgery or by via telephone. At times your medication may need to be reviewed and this will be done by Abdul.

Adbul is in surgery every alternative Monday and available via telephone the week he is not in surgery.

Online Appointments

We're pleased to see more patients using our online appointment booking system, and as a result, appointments are being taken up much faster than before.



To meet this increased demand, we're adjusting our appointment system to make more online access appointments available. We hope this will make it easier for everyone to book the care they need when they need it.

However, we kindly ask that you only book the appointments you intend to keep. Some patients have booked multiple appointments in advance and not attended them, which prevents others from accessing care. Please only book appointments you genuinely need, and remember to cancel if you're unable to attend.

Surgery Updates

Telephone System



We will soon be introducing a new telephone service to make ordering your repeat medications easier. When you call the surgery, you'll be able to select an option for medication requests. You'll then be asked which medications you require from your usual repeat list, responding with "yes" or "no" to confirm each one.

If the medication you need isn't listed, you'll have the opportunity to make an additional request. Your request will go directly to your GP's secure mailbox on the system, where it will be processed in the usual way, either sent to the pharmacy or followed up by a member of staff if further information is needed.

Website Requests



Since 30th September, patients have been able to make medical requests online through our website. Please note that this service should not be used for urgent matters; these must still be phoned through to the surgery.

Your online request will be reviewed by a clinician, and someone from the surgery will then either contact you to arrange an appointment or send you a message with instructions from the clinician.


This new service is designed to make communication easier and more convenient, but it does not replace the option to book face-to-face or telephone appointments.

Book recommendation



Dr S McKelvie would like to recommend a book to those with family or friends with cancer or terminal illness - "Being Mortal" by Atul Gawande.



Being Mortal by Atul Gawande is a deeply moving exploration of ageing, medicine, and what it means to live well right up to the end. Examines how modern medicine and patients in today's world often focus on prolonging life at all costs. There's no thought to take a step back to really think about 'how do I want to live the rest of my life?'

Through personal stories, patient experiences, and reflections on his own family, he challenges the medical profession to have honest conversations about death, independence, and the kind of care people truly want as they near the end of life.

Ultimately, Being Mortal is both a critique of the healthcare system and a compassionate call to rethink how we approach mortality, reminding us that being mortal is not just about dying, but about living fully until we do.







Repeat Prescriptions Guide

Requesting a repeat prescription

You can request repeat prescriptions via the following methods:



- In the surgery
- On the NHS or Patient Access App



In very rare and exceptional cases, you can phone in for a prescription.

Do you have multiple items prescribed each month?

If you have two items or more per month, long or short term, it may be more cost effective to get an **NHS Prescription Prepayment Certificate**. The PPC costs:

£32.05 for 3 months £114.50 for 12 months



You can also pay monthly by direct debit. The prescription charge in England is £9.90 per item.

If you get prescriptions for HRT, you could save more with the HRT Prescription Prepayment Certificate (HRT PPC). This is a one-off payment of £19.80 (the cost of two single items).

The HRT PPC covers an unlimited number of certain HRT medicines for 12 months, regardless of why they are prescribed.



Community Falls Responder Service (non-injurious falls)

Guildford and Waverley Health and Care Alliance is working in partnership with Mole Valley Life to provide Guildford and Waverley residents with a non-injurious falls response service.

If you have a fall at home and you have no pain or injury, a qualified Community Falls Responder will attend within 45 minutes (60 minutes in rural areas), to help you up using specialist lifting equipment and make you safe and comfortable.

Service is available 7 days a week 6am-9pm Call **0300 369 0590**

Able to weight bear



Today (26/08/2025) is ten years since my brother David - Whisker's passed away. Sadly David was taken from us after a 15 day battle. He had a Glioblastoma of the right side of his brain.

I shall be flying to Nepal on 3rd October to start my trek to Annapurna base camp on 7th October. Ideally altitude allowing me I shall be doing the trek over 8 days, achieving the height 5,416 meters (17,769 feet) above sea level. 



Launching 8th September 2025
